SHARINGS FROM THE PASTOR

The season of Lent is rapidly approaching. Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, and a day of fast and abstinence. The fast (one meal, with two other eating times that do not equal the one meal) is required of all Catholics between 18 and 60, unless serious health issues make this risky. Good Friday is the other Lenten day of fast.

Abstinence is required on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays in Lent. This means that no meat may be eaten on these days. Fish and eggs are allowed, but soups with a meat base, along with poultry, pork, beef, veal, etc. are to be avoided. All Catholics over the age of fourteen are obliged to the abstinence rule.

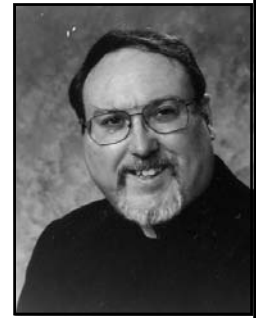
These common Lenten penances are meant to help us solidify our identity with the Catholic community of faith around the world. There is some consolation in remembering that nearly a billion people around the world are entering the season of Lent with us and are following the same penitential practices for these days. Of course, the Church hopes that we will all do more for Lent than just these acts of fasting and abstinence. The Church asks us to look into our own lives and needs, however, so that we can freely choose a pattern for Lent that will truly help us grow in our sense of discipleship with the Lord Jesus.

Fasting and abstinence are aspects of the basic discipline of freely depriving ourselves of something good, so that we will strengthen our ability to refrain from sinful actions when we are tempted. Since we are so different, we realize that no one action will truly be a penance for everyone. Thus the practice has arisen of letting each one choose his or her Lenten penance.

Underlying this idea of Lenten penance is the call to prayer and almsgiving. By taking some extra time for prayer each day, we cannot help but deepen our relationship with our loving God: Father, Son and Spirit. The form of prayer might be daily Mass (or even one Mass per week in addition to Sunday). It might take the form of meditation for ten minutes or so each day. It might take the form of a daily rosary. Another form of prayer, particularly appropriate during Lent, would be the Stations of the Cross. We offer this devotion in communal form on Friday nights. At seven o'clock we pray them in English. At eight o'clock we pray them in Polish.

There are two sets of stations in the Church. One is along the back wall of the main area of the Church. The other is along the wall in the weekday chapel that is across from the stained glass windows. Any time there are no services going on in these areas, individuals are

invited to pray the stations privately. Almsgiving can be practiced through monetary donations to charitable groups. Our Saint Vincent DePaul Society and the P.A.D.S. program and the monthly collection of food for the food pantry at Saint Benedict in Blue Island (also serving Saint Peter Claver Mission in Robbins)



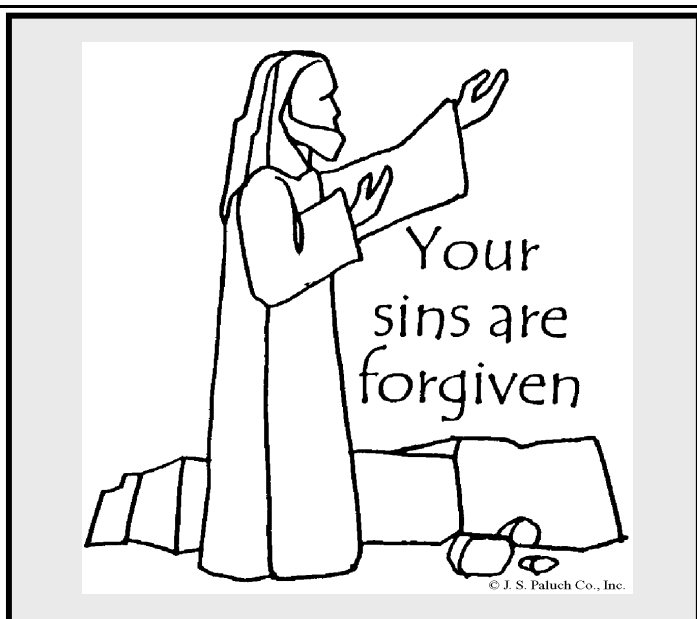
are local ministries of service to the needy. Other national and international organizations also do good work, and your almsgiving can be directed to any of those groups as well.

We believe, as Catholics, that our God has called us to these practices through our Baptisms. There is a real hope that Lent helps us deepen and intensify our response to this ongoing call of our God. We use Lent as a time to improve our skills in discipleship. We try to heighten our awareness of the various levels of communion that we belong to because of our membership in the Church, the Mystical Body of Christ.

As we have already mentioned, we have a Lenten mission scheduled for March 18, 19 and 20. This is another way to make good use of the Lenten season to fortify ourselves for our mission as disciples of Jesus. This will include the sacrament of reconciliation on Monday night and a special Mission Mass on Tuesday night. We encourage everyone to make every effort to attend the mission, all three nights, if possible, or as much as your schedule will allow. The mission is open to all parishioners, regardless of age or gender. Please take advantage of this opportunity to reflect upon the role of faith in your life, and in the ways that God is calling you to deepen your relationship with Jesus, His Son.

Lent begins, as we have mentioned, on Ash Wednesday. Lent officially ends on Holy Thursday evening, just before the Solemn Liturgy of the Lord's Supper. With that liturgy the Sacred Triduum begins. This is the celebration of the central mysteries of our faith. The three days are intended to be one extended prayer. The Solemn Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday and the Easter Vigil Service on Holy Saturday night are also part of these special days. Later in Lent we will point out how we indicate the unity of these liturgical celebrations. In the meantime, my prayer is that everyone in the parish gets Lent off to a great start.

PARISH MISSION

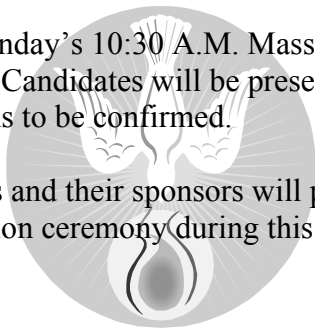

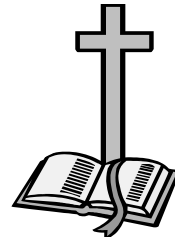

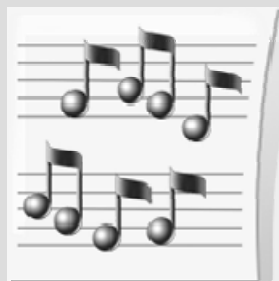

CHORAL NOTES

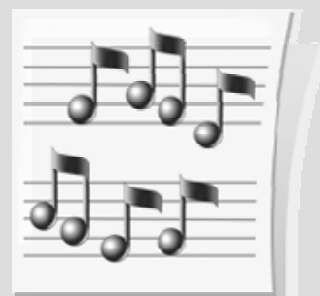
This Sunday, the Sacred Heart Chorale sings “Kyrie” from Gabriel Fauré’s *Messe Basse* at the 10:30A.M. Mass. Fauré, a French Romantic composer, lived from May 12, 1845 to November 4, 1924. Known predominantly as an organist and choirmaster, Fauré held several prominent church positions as well as administrative and teaching positions in the French conservatories. Prominent works include *Pavane*, *Requiem*, nocturnes for piano, and the art songs “Après un Rêve” (After a Dream) and “Clair de Lune” (Moonlight).

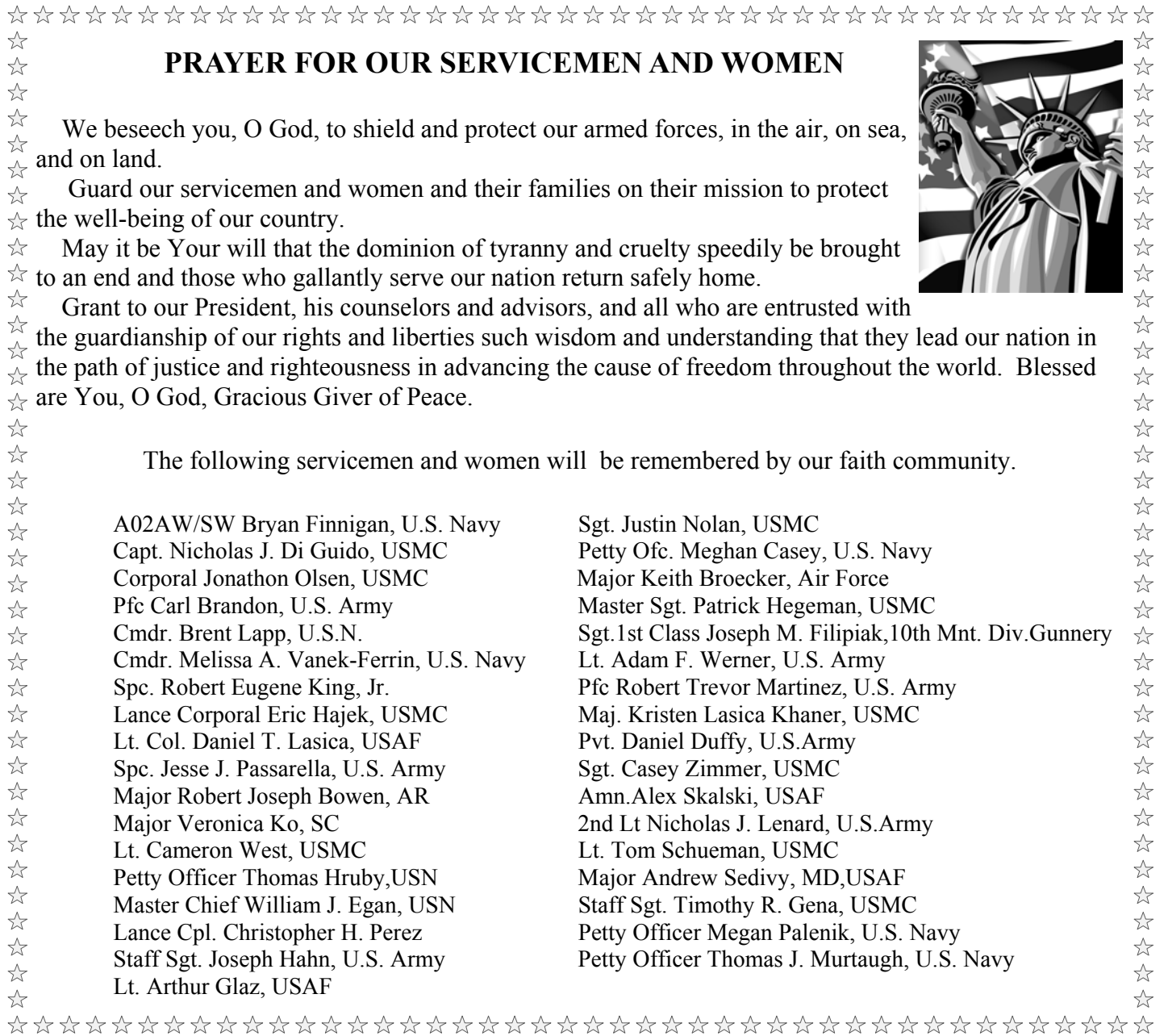
Originally composed in 1881, Fauré scored this low mass for three part female chorus, solo violin, and organ. Yet, this work underwent revision in 1907, when Fauré composed a new Kyrie and separate Benedictus, while omitting the Gloria. Orchestrated for a soprano soloist, two part female chorus, and harmonium, this revision consisted of four movements. Of these four movements, the first and last movements, “Kyrie” and “Agnus Dei”, have been sung at Sacred Heart. The “Kyrie” is the only movement featuring the soprano soloist, and contains an antecedent/consequent motivic structure. In other words, the music lines alternating between the soloist and the chorus function as question and answer. This movement portrays a notion of seamlessness through overlapping trade-offs between soloist and choir at the same pitch (either unison or octave). Moreover, this setting of the Penitential Act evokes a mood of three P’s: peacefully serene, prayerfully sublime, and profoundly penitential.

During this holy season of Lent, let us continue to ask God for mercy, being mindful of the message in today’s Gospel: “This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel.”
